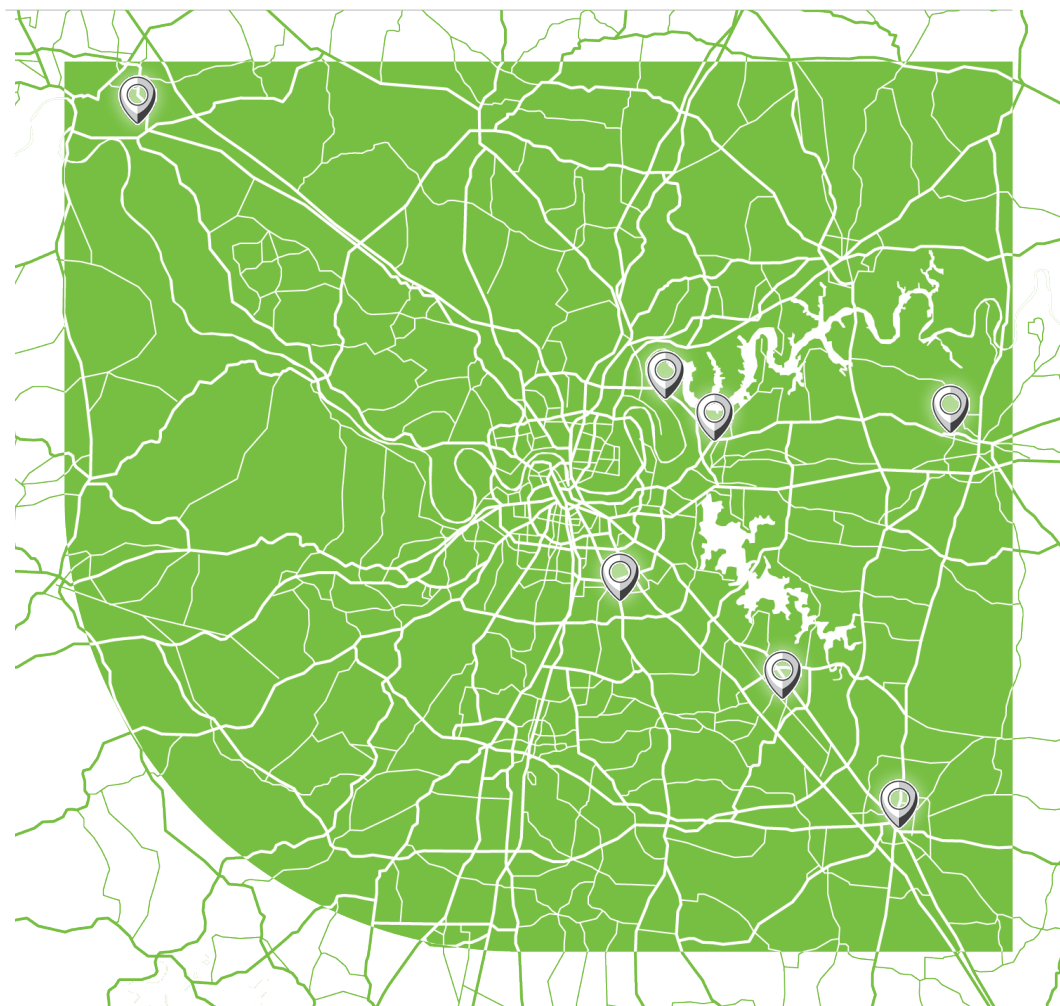

Medicare (MA and Part D)

As of 2023, Humana serves 5.7 million beneficiaries enrolled in MA plans and 2.9 million beneficiaries in Medicare Prescription Drug coverage. Humana offers MA plans in 49 states, Washington D.C., and Puerto Rico, covering 91% of U.S. counties. 96% of Humana's MA members are in plans rated 4 Stars or higher (out of 5 Stars). 66% are in plans rated 4.5 Stars or higher.¹⁵



Medicaid

Humana currently serves approximately 1 million Medicaid members across seven states – Florida, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Ohio, South Carolina, and Wisconsin. Humana will also begin serving Oklahoma and Indiana Medicaid in 2024.

What is Medicare Advantage?

For 20+ years, the Medicare Advantage (MA) program has been integral to the Medicare guarantee, offering choices and meeting the comprehensive healthcare needs of American seniors and those with disabilities. With a limit on out-of-pocket costs and often Part D prescription drug coverage included, MA plans deliver cost-effective, high-quality coverage for today's seniors—while covering all services provided under FFS Medicare.

The savings generated through MA's focus on care coordination and improving health outcomes are reinvested into lowering premiums and providing supplemental benefits such as dental, vision, and hearing. In addition, the program provides flexibility to offer important non-medical services that can improve health, such as in-home meals for the home-bound and transportation to and from medical appointments. These services, along with MA's focus on primary care, and access to telehealth services and in-home care, promote a holistic approach to meeting beneficiaries' health needs.
